



## News and Views from around the bonfire

A Happy New Year to one and all. The summer weather has been rather erratic, but I hope you have been able to take advantage of the fine spells and get out camping. The past 12 Months has been interesting and challenging, to say the least. We look forward with bated breath to see what 2021 will bring us. With more and more Kiwi's taking to camping as a holiday option and an extremely limited foreign tourist "camper" numbers, it will be interesting to see just how the Government and local Councils deal with the changing face of camping in New Zealand. (there are still about 10 000 foreign tourists who have been unable to get home and are for the meantime, stuck in NZ.)

The NEW Minister of Tourism, Hon Stuart Nash has shown in his comments on camping that he has an exceptionally low opinion of the camping/backpacker tourist. The Ministry of Tourism, under the Ministers direction is currently undertaking a "limited" survey on sections of the camping industry. Particularly targeting smaller camper vans with aims at creating more **new** regulations on self-containment and freedom camping. The results of this one-sided survey are expected to be released for public discussion in March of this year. The Club is involved in this through our sister organization, NZ Lifestyle Camping, and is desperately trying to get a more balanced result.

This is just one of the many, behind the scenes activities the Club is involved in on behalf of New Zealand campers. You will see from a couple of the following articles some of the workload involved with dealing with Govt Ministers and their Departments. Then there is also the club camps arranged by the Regional Reps. Waikato/BoP area is by far leading the pack, with at least one camp each month, and well attended. Thanks Mary (Rep) & Lyn (club VP) for your efforts in this area. Other areas need your support by either helping arrange a camp or attending one or two. It does get a little disheartening, after organizing and



promoting a club camp and only a handful of regular's attending. Do not get me wrong, it is always great to catch up with old friends but even better to make new ones. Remember **ALL** Club Camps are open to **ALL** campers, not just Club Members.

Talking about Club Members. We have, on our Facebook Chat Share page 6200-page members with 126 in the last week, imagine what we could do if they were all Financial Club members. As of 31st December 2020 (our clubs 5<sup>th</sup> Birthday) we had our 2844<sup>th</sup> member join us. The minimal \$35 joining fee and \$30 annual renewal can be quickly regained from the many discounts available to members. Your membership and renewal greatly help us both financially and in numbers as a club to promote and advocate for a balanced camping industry in New Zealand. Help us support you and the future of camping in NZ by becoming an All Points Camping Club Member and by renewing your annual membership. #### Communications with the Minister of Tourism

The following letter was sent to the Hon S. Nash, Minister of Tourism early December 2020. This was to introduce the All Points camping Club, our views and who we represent to the New Tourism Minister. This was particularly relevant at that time due to public comments made by the Minister in respect to the freedom and budget campers in New Zealand that in His view have no place in the tourist market and He will be directing his and his Departments efforts towards the "high end, high dollar tourist". His own Departments (MBIE) figures show that the so called "low end" tourist stays in NZ longer and spends more, up to 60% of the tourist income comes from this sector.

After 4 weeks I did receive a reply from the tourism Ministry stating receipt of the letter and our concerns and the letter would be forwarded to the Minister and relevant officials and to expect a response in due course.

#### The Letter as follows,

The Minister of Tourism The Honourable Stuart Nash **Parliament Buildings** Wellington

#### Dear Sir

I am the President of All Points Camping NZ, the second Camping NZ is an inclusive camping club growing on an average of 30 new members each week. By inclusive we your predecessor provide a service which includes ALL forms of camping, from motor-homes to tents. All Points Camping NZ through our partner organisation, NZ Lifestyle Camping is an issuing authority for Certified Self Containment with an ever-growing list of testing officers throughout New Zealand. APCNZ promotes responsible, balanced, sustainable, and affordable camping to all campers whatever form their camping takes. We are not opposed to the Self Containment standard, although it does require updating, in a responsible manner that does not adversely affect those that are currently certified. We are however, opposed to the use of the standard NZS 5465:2001 which is being put to by some groups and Councils. Restricting entire regions to only

certified vehicles, limits the camping and travel options of most of the NZ camping community.

With the advent of Covid and closed borders, the High End Tourist that you promote and want in this Country are going to be few and far between with the borders remaining closed for the foreseeable future. Our tourist market has changed dramatically. Instead of foreign tourists, Kiwis are now traveling and exploring Aotearoa. A lot of these Kiwis are choosing camping as an affordable option to see the country. Labelling these responsible/ freedom campers as low-end tourists is both derogatory and incorrect. There is nothing free about any form of camping. Your own department, MBIEs figures show that the so-called low-end tourists spend equates to 60% of the national tourist income. Many of these foreign tourists are young and healthy and contribute to the communities they visit. Many work part time as they travel, in jobs most Kiwis do not want to do, like fruit picking for example, that greatly assists that export market.

If you believe the national and social media the main problems with freedom campers is, overcrowding and waste management. Both these issues are easily fixed. Provide more camping space and facilities, along with education. Telling campers that they must stay in commercial campgrounds is financially out of reach for many of them and they would rather spend that money on local attractions. Restricting and closing camping areas only moves the problem down the road. More low-cost camping options are preferred and easy to set largest camping organisation in New Zealand. All Points up. Two examples of these are Kiwicamp.nz and the Iwi low-cost joint venture camping proposal that I sent to Ministry and the Development.

> We are in a unique situation, due to the effects of Covid with closed borders. Let's make the most of this and make changes that will benefit all concerned parties. Unfortunately, both Government and local bodies listen to one national camping organisation when making decisions. This organisation has been running for 63 years and does great things for their members. Their members MUST be certified self-contained and only represent a very small section of the camping community.

Freedom Campers may not spend a lot, if any, on accommodation. Campers do spend in the towns they stay in, food, fuel, groceries, general shopping, activities and much more. The benefits of allowing campers to stay in a district are many and varied. Some districts, Gisborne, Selwyn and Whanganui to name a few have welcomed freedom campers with open arms and put strategies in place to benefit all All Points Camping NZ is more than willing to make many areas to all forms of campers from traveling our great country. motorhomes to tents. Toilets, dump stations, rubbish bags and collection is provided and paid for from the modest camping fees. The only requirement is that each permit holder has a chemical toilet.

Dear Wayne,

Thank you for writing to me on 9 December 2020 regarding camping in New Zealand. Thank you also for the work that All Points Camping NZ does to promote responsible and sustainable forms of camping.

Supporting responsible camping fits within my strategic focus to grow the value that visitors bring to New Zealand while ensuring that communities and the environment do not bear the costs. I am currently receiving advice on how we can achieve this, including on improving the regulatory system for self-contained vehicles.

I acknowledge that many freedom campers are New Zealanders and contribute value to New Zealand. They often travel widely across our regions and contribute to local economies. However, there are some instances where poorly behaved freedom campers negatively impact the environment, and this is not acceptable.

This is why my focus is on high-value visitors – not the number of visitors to New Zealand. There are many ways to travel the country, and many ways to generate value. People who responsibly camp certainly add value for New Zealand and it is important that they continue to see the value in travelling here.

Thank you for taking the time to contact me about this important matter and for your feedback. I am meeting with a range of stakeholders and I look forward to discussing how we can improve the regulatory system for responsible camping.

Once again, thank you for taking the time to contact me about this important matter.


#### Les and Shirley from Hamilton:



The Stop and Stay Network is open to all NZ campers and travellers to access, list properties and share.

The Stop and Stay listings can be viewed online and downloaded or printed.

#### How does the listing service work?

The Stop and Stay listing service is available to all NZ campers and designed to be accessed by all devices. Stopover properties and locations can be recommended online and are reviewed before listing. The Stop and Stay listing service is not designed to list all camping properties in NZ but only those that come recommended.

#### Can I list or recommend a Stop and Stay location, property or business?

Yes, simply go to the Stop and Stay website and click on the recommendation link. This will take you to a simple online form.

#### Do I have to be an All Points Camping Club member to stay at one of the listed properties?

The Stop and Stay listings are available to all NZ campers but some properties may have limitations such as no dogs or self contained campers only.

#### What if I think a property should not be listed?

If you feel that a property should not be shown on our Stop and Stay listings please email us at info@allpointscampingnz.org giving you reasons.

#### Can I just turn up or should I book?

It is always courtesy to contact your hosts before hand, particularly if it is a private property.

#### Why isn't the StopandStay network set up as a mobile app?

The StopandStay network is managed on a volunteer basis through the All Points Camping Club of NZ. As a not for profit organisation we cannot yet justify the cost of developing an app but will look to this option in the future.

#### Freedom Camping Adventure in New Zealand

Following is an inspirational story about Shoshanna. A young woman dealing with some major health issues and a young son on her own, and how she accomplished a life long dream of hers to travel New Zealand. This is Part One of her story.

These are Shoshanna's words edited for our magazine.

A lifetime goal of mine has been to travel the length of New Zealand with my best friend.

We had planned to save up and then travel the world together. Back in 2017 I had a skiing accident and broke my spine and then discovered I was pregnant and had my son. This and dealing with anxiety, depression, panic attacks, major fears and fatigue all took a toll on my mental health. Then just prior to Lockdown I moved back to New Zealand after two years in Australia. My baby and I were staying with family during Lockdown, which was intense. Not having our own space. We survived by learning to make Flax Baskets, a lot of them, and going for walks.

After lockdown I decided to drive down to Dunedin from Nelson to visit my mum . I hadn't really planned to travel much but once I got to Dunedin, I realised it was fun and definitely doable. I planned another short trip down to the Catlins from Dunedin. I borrowed a foam mattress from my mum and planned to stay at the Purakanui beach DOC Campsite to save money before driving to bluff and on to Invercargill to stay with some cousins there. I then carried on to Te Anau, staying with more cousins and taking a cruise up Milford sounds which was absolutely amazing. I carried my 18 month at the time in a baby carrier for all our excursions which helped massively while travelling solo.

From Te Anau we travelled to Queenstown. I didn't love Queenstown, it was too posh and fancy for this roughing it kiwi camper and it was too cold. However,







#### **Self Containment Issuing Authority**

www.nzlifestylecamping.com

Our nationwide network of qualified self-containment testing officers continues to grow. These include professional businesses and individuals who believe in the fair application of the Self Containment Standard NZS 5465:2001. All testing officers are required to correctly and fairly apply the standard.

NZLC believe that every person camping in NZ has a responsibility for our environment and that certified Self Containment of campervans and motor caravans is a step towards achieving sustainable camping. Any person may approach our testing officers for a self-containment check, advice or installation. You do not need to be a member of any organisation.

#### Have a converted van / campervan, Pop Top Camper, Slide on or rooftop camper?

If your vehicle meets the requirements we will certify it. Each vehicle conversion is considered separately.

#### Note: There is no vehicle exclusion list under the standard for Certified Self Contained vehicles.

But the vehicle interior must be 'designed' and fit for habitation, and you must have sufficient room to adequately use the toilet inside the vehicle when required or we will not approve it. Many large people movers and small vans are designed for two people to be able to sleep in them. To be able to be certified for self containment the vehicle must have cooking facilities and meet the fresh water, waste water and toileting requirements of the NZ standard.

#### How much does it cost?

NZ Lifestyle Camping charges \$40.00 processing / administration fee to cover our national costs. The testing officer will usually charge you for their service and any materials they need to make your vehicle comply. This should be expected.

Many campers choose to take advantage of the special offer of annual membership to the All points Camping Club and national discounts, for an extra \$15.00. \$55.00 combined processing and issue fee.

#### Where can I get this done and how long will it take?

Check the following list of qualified testing officers or go to the NZ Lifestyle Camping website. The self containment check may take around 30 minutes or more depending on what is required. Once the completed checklist is received by NZLC it usually takes 4 to 5 working days for the final processing and delivery. This can take longer subject to information requirements, holidays and delivery delays.

Campers, our friendly and conscientious testing officers will help you to get your vehicle certified for self-containment.

Please make contact during normal business hours.

Never leave it to the last minute.

### Background

Leave No Trace (LNT) New Zealand seeks to educate and challenge the New Zealand public and visitors on how and why to minimise their environmental impacts while enjoying natural and cultural heritage areas.

LNT language is used internationally and aims to develop people's environmental ethics. Rather than a set of rules, LNT promotes ethical choices through a framework of seven principles.



## The Seven Principles of Leave No Trace

#### PLAN AHEAD AND PREPARE

Plan ahead by considering your goals and those of your group. Know before you go-get local information, skills and gear you need to make your trip a success.

#### ► TRAVEL AND CAMP ON DURABLE GROUND

Some areas are more fragile than others. Choose to camp and travel on the most durable surface you can, the best ones are tracks, gravel, snow and most grasses. Impacts on fragile natural features caused by travel and camping can take many years to heal.

#### **▶ DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY**

Pack it in, pack it out. As users of the outdoors we all have a responsibility to clean up after ourselves. Rubbish and toilet waste are unsightly and can introduce unwanted organisms into the environment. Lead by example, if you see rubbish, pick it up.

#### LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND

People visit natural areas for many reasons; such as exploring nature's mysteries and surprises. When we leave natural objects and artifacts as we found them, we pass the gift of discovery on to those who follow. Many sites of spiritual and cultural significance to Māori are interwoven with the natural environment.

#### ► MINIMISE THE EFFECTS OF FIRE

Local regulations and conditions change depending on time of year and location. Lightweight stoves, fire pans and mounds mean campfires are no longer essential for cooking or comfort. Wildfires are often caused by carelessness and the natural appearance of many recreation sites has been damaged by campfires, visual scarring and stripping vegetation for firewood.

#### ► RESPECT WILDLIFE AND FARM ANIMALS

Know when animals are particularly vulnerable, such as breeding times, and change your behaviour with them by observing from a distance. Avoid feeding animals either deliberately or accidentally by leaving food or rubbish lying around. Farming is a big part of New Zealand's culture and economy, know how to move through farms without disturbing farm animals.

#### **▶** BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHERS

We all go into the outdoors for different reasons, so we must share. Think about others, respect their activities and what they might be trying to get out of their recreational experience.
